A Word from Pastor Jennifer

How do you rank yourself? How do you rank others? According to James 2:8 the "royal law" is to love your neighbor as yourself. The reality is that most of us have neighbors we would rank as less deserving of love or attention than others. James notes that this often breaks down along lines of relative wealth and poverty. And we recognize other differences among people that we tend to rank, such as physical and mental ability, race and country of origin, or gender and sexual identity. Pastor Jason's sermon this week will especially highlight the discernment and decisions of Mennonite Church USA delegates with respect to correcting some ways in which our denomination has ranked and harmed members of the body of Christ. The good news is that Jesus leads us in another way, a "royal" or kingdom way that recognizes everyone's value in the church. Bruce Buckwalter and Rose Shenk worked as Country Representatives for Mennonite Central Committee (MCC) in Addis Ababa, Ethiopia from 2016-2021. During those five years they managed MCC's projects throughout the country, working closely with partner organizations by providing funding, capacity-building, training, supplies, and monitoring and evaluation. MCC has partners working in

all sectors, including peace, disaster relief, migration, health, education, water and sanitation, and agriculture. To observe MCC partner work on the ground, Bruce and Rose were privileged to travel to all regions of Ethiopia and had the unique opportunity to be guests and colleagues in rich and interesting places. Bruce and Rose will be sharing their experiences at CMC at 10:45 am in the sanctuary.






Meals Needed
